#### WHAT NEXT?

Believe it or not in the midst of our lockdown, it is time to begin to think about Journey planning for the years ahead.

#### 2021

We have already been assigned Journeys for 2021 with tentative months:

- Dallas outgoing in May
- Oita, Japan incoming in August
- Niagara and Toronto outgoing in October.
- We are also hoping to reschedule our incoming Global Bike Journey which must be held in September to coincide with Bike The Barns.

That would give us quite a full year in 2021 assuming that people wish to travel to and from these assignments. We are fortunate that our first outgoing Journeys will be in the US and Canada as they are easier to get to and the potential travel bans will likely not apply to these assignments.

In order to contact the Dallas and Canada clubs to try agree on journey times, we ask each of you who are potentially interested in visiting either Dallas or Canada or both in 2021 to contact our Journey Coordinator, Stephanie Sorensen by the end of July so she can make timely contact with those clubs. We also need to know if we have no one in our Club who is willing to either travel or be a home host in 2021.

We also will contact the Oita Club to find out if they think they would feel comfortable coming to the US in 2021.

#### 2022

Within the next few months we have to submit our requests for **incoming 2022** Journeys. We will be asking the clubs we visited in Australia last year if they would like to come here in 2022. We can also invite another Club if there is a strong expressed preference for that Club.

Requests for **2022 outgoing** Journeys are submitted to FFI in the Fall. We will be chatting about preferences at our picnic on July 7. Anyone who will not be attending the picnic and who has a specific request and is likely to participate in a Journey to that place, let Stephanie know by the end of July so that she can incorporate our priority preferences.

Those of you who had signed up to go to New Caledonia and New Zealand or who had considered it - do you still want to go to one or both places? 2022 seems far away now, but there must be something on your list of places you really want to see. COVID 19 can't keep us down forever!

# LET'S WALK, LET'S HIKE


On June 26, eight of our members enjoyed a pleasant hike in Donald County Park. The view of the surrounding landscape was beautiful from the top of Donald Rock.


And then there was George Wysock's birthday in Vyborg, Russia. This lovely lady made a birthday shirt for George, which is truly a thing of beauty.

# FFI FUNDRAISING UPDATE AND MIDWEST PRESIDENTS' MEETING

Meeting summary from Dale Moore (FFI Regional Rep) from Midwest Presidents' Meeting.

# **Fundraising**

The FFI website lists donations at \$316K. However, many of the donations from Europe are being held in an account and are yet to be transferred. There is also a lag in recording mail in donations. The unofficial estimate is that the actual total is over \$400K.

FFI also received an award of more than \$100K from the Paycheck Protection Plan. This is a nice bonus since it was not included in FFI's cash flow plan.

FFI will "soft close" the funding initiative at the end of June. Of course, donations will still be accepted after June.

FFI's cash flow plan also included member renewals for 2021 - - Approximately 9000 renewals were included in the plan. Therefore, a continuing challenge for club leadership is to keep their members interested and engaged. Sandi Wysock shared that FFI Madison plans to waive club dues for members in 2021 and the club will pay the FFI dues using reserve funds.

#### 2021 Journeys

FFI recommends that clubs continue to plan 2021 journeys, but not to involve money until it is certain that the journey can be safely conducted.
