# OPEN WORLD WELCOMES WOMEN IN STEM - RUSSIA

#### COMPLETED JOURNEY TO AUSTRALIA

Oct 26 - Nov 10, 2019

Eleven members of our club were hosted by the Central Coast and Tweed Valley Clubs on the Eastern Coast of Australia. Both clubs were very small with 20-25 members.

Central Coast is about 90 minutes North of Sydney and in a beautiful coastal area. Each beach was more beautiful than the last. We visited a pearl farm, a wildlife park, a gallery with aboriginal art, a fruit beverage factory and of course beaches. At the pearl farm we learned how the seed pearl is inserted into the shell and watched as our guide "birthed" a pearl.

We toured the Mortels Sheepskin Factory which claims to have made the first UGG boots which were so named because Frank Mortels' wife thought they were so ugly. proclaimed them to be ugly.

Tweed Valley is just south of Brisbane. The valley is in the caldera of an old volcano. There were sugar cane fields throughout the valley as well as small farms with horses and cattle. We toured a sugar cane factory, visited a wildlife park and of course enjoyed the beautiful seascapes. One of the highlights of our time in Tweed Valley was our day at Lorenne and Doug Brown's farm during Melbourne cup days and watched the actual Melbourne cup race on television. It was great fun!

#### JANET LONERGAN

Janet and her husband Ralph joined Friendship Force in 1986. Both served as long term members of the board; exchange directors; hosts and ambassadors. Because they lived in Lodi, they focused on day hosting and hosting exchange reunion get togethers at their home on the lake. The entire membership was invited to those events. Club membership numbered nearly 600 in those days. "Back then, she said, there was lots of interest because FFI was unique and out of the ordinary. There were more exchanges and people were interested in coming to the US."

After Ralph died in 2004, Janet continued on as Newsletter Editor - a position she held for 20 years. She recalls that at first, she wrote the articles on a typewriter, then cut and pasted before delivering prototypes to the printer. With the help of Mary and Gary Lindquist, they hand-addressed 300 newsletters a month! The newsletter became easier to write and produce when computers became the norm. Janet continued on the board as Historian after retiring as newsletter editor.

# FRIENDS WE LOST

Dick was an avid traveler throughout his adult life, always accompanied by his wife, Margy. Their world travels included many popular tourist spots on six continents, but also included less common destinations such as China, Mongolia, Azerbaijan, South Africa, Zimbabwe, and Siberia.

Many such trips were arranged through Friendship Force of Madison, for which he and Margy hosted many international visitors coming to Madison. Hawaii was also a popular winter destination, where he and Margy visited with family and the many friends they made there over the years.

Dick came to UW Madison in 1965 with a PhD in Information Science, retiring in 1995 after an illustrious career as a professor of science literature, studying how scientists communicated, especially geologists and water resource scientists and technicians. He served as major advisor for a number of doctoral students using bibliometrics, including citation analysis techniques. His two most recent books were "Scientific and Technical Literature: An Introduction to Communication Forms" with C.D. Hurt, and "Patents as Scientific and Technical Literature."
