Gail Holmes was director for our 15-day July 2013 outbound domestic exchange of 13 ambassadors with Mid-Willamette Valley in Oregon and Lower Columbia in Washington State.

Sandi Wysock was ED for the Vyborg, Russia 5-day inbound exchange in September 2013 and for our 2012 Moscow/Vyborg outbound exchange. This was Vyborg's first outbound exchange.

2015 Exchange Announcements

Helen Ann reported we were not given a 2015 outbound international exchange. We were given an inbound international with Hsinchu, Taiwan but as of yet have not accepted and April 15 was the deadline. There are 90 Clubs in the USA, 32 did not get an outbound international exchange in 2015. We could travel to Australia, New Zealand, Santo Angelo, Brazil and a specialized program in Nanjing, China. It is possible others may become available as the matching process continues.

2014 Exchange Updates

Tucson/Phoenix, Arizona Outbound, Nancy Mueller was the ED for the exchange for 22 Ambassadors from February 15-28.

Berlin Germany/tour extension to Poland Outbound -- May 15 to June 1, Lise Skofronick & Stephanie Sorensen co-directors said they are ready to begin their exchange.

Utah Inbound -- July 16 to 22, Donna Hussin, director, is looking for hosts for the exchange.

Arts and Architecture Global Inbound – August 23-28, an exchange with Northern Illinois and Milwaukee. Donna Calvert, director, has the exchange planned and also needs hosts.

United Kingdom/Costa Rica Inbound -- September 18-25, Gail Holmes, director, will begin working on the exchange later in the spring.

CLUB NEWS

What has changed....

- The board decided to discontinue our table at the Farmers Market. Thank you to Mary Ann Fahl for chairing this effort in the past years.
- For the first time in my memory we were unable to fill an OB International Exchange. This was supposed to be in 2013 to Indonesia and despite great efforts by Ariel Ford it was not to be.
- In March, the board voted to discontinue mailing the newsletter effective January 2015. The cost is about \$14.55 per member. Newsletters will be available on line with a notification by email.
- Dues to Atlanta are increasing in 2015 by \$5 for individuals and \$8 for families. Dues for 2015 remain the same, except an extra \$10 will be assessed those who request a hard copy newsletter be mailed to them.

What is new...

- Craft Group Started in 2013 and is devoted to crafts of all kinds. They have met 7 times in member homes and 16 members have participated. Primarily a social event and to experiment with creating crafts to give or sell.
- New activities with inbound exchanges—Offered in 2013 were tours of EPIC, Verona Library, Native American Foods Dinner at the State Historical Society, University of Wisconsin campus tour, Children's Museum tour, horse demonstration by member Kay Kinney, American Breeders in DeForest tour and one of Helen Ann's favorites, a visit to a Robotic Dairy Farm.
- Outreach is expanding with the new coordinators, Mary B and Sandi W. They need photos to create a DVD to use in presentations to spread the word of FFWI.
- We now have a club pin and luggage tags for sale. These are due to Gail Holmes persistence.
- We had a table at the International Festival held annually in February at Overture Center. We will continue this outreach as it generated a good deal of interest. This was chaired by Nancy Brown and 10 other volunteers.
- We formed a relationship with International Institute of Wisconsin. Jane Kessenich, Lise Skofronick, Stephanie Sorenson, Patrick Fleming Sandi Wysock and Helen Ann Rugowski have dinner hosted.
- Sandy Drew directed an Open World Legislators exchange from the Ukraine in February, 2013 and we have indicated to Atlanta that we are interested in further Open Worlds in Madison.

The U.S. Department of State often brings groups of future leaders from other countries to the



U.S. for visits to educate and expose them to experts in their fields here. Sometimes they come to Wisconsin for five to seven days. When they do, their visits are coordinated here by the International Institute of Wisconsin, headquartered in Milwaukee. Often their time in Wisconsin involves a home hosted dinner. This social event provides the visitors an opportunity to see typical homes and to get to know "regular" people. We are very fortunate to be able to participate in these dinners and have the opportunity to learn about these young people and their countries. They are very talented and bright.

Several of us have participated in these dinners in the past. We have found it easier, if some of the effort can be shared. It is difficult to clean the house, cook an entire meal, pick up and drop off the guests, and clean up the dishes alone. We would like to try to coordinate these more effectively, to share the work a bit more, as well as share, the fascinating conversations we always have.

I will be coordinating these opportunities when they arise. There is no particular schedule and sometimes we do not have a great deal of notice. I would like to compile a list of those interested in: hosting a dinner in their home, attending a dinner, bringing a dish to share, or willing to pick up the dinner participants and drive them to and from the dinner. You can select as many as you are comfortable with, can do different things for different dinners, and you do not have to do every one of them, only when it is convenient for your schedule.
