A NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT

The book club had a wonderful discussion on March 21, 2016 about the book, "Cuba Diaries." Since President Obama was in Cuba at the time, it was a very timely discussion. As we left, Bernie Long indicated that participation in the Friendship Force had changed the way he reads the headlines. I couldn't agree more. Only last week, I received a message from Ezgi Varol, a college student in Ankara, Turkey and prior ambassador to Madison, assuring me that she is safe although the bombing in Ankara was at a bus stop she used frequently. Without Friendship Force the news from Ankara would have been a footnote amongst all the other news but because of the Friendship Force, the news was more personal and I was able to see and read comments from my hosts in Turkey and their friends. I would agree with Bernie Friendship Force has changed the way I read the news.

With the recent attack in Brussels, I would ask that you light a candle for those victims and all of the victims of terrorism worldwide. Once again events will seem more personal because The Friendship Force has "Changed the Way We See the World." Although there are fewer conflicts around the world today, the randomness of terrorism increases the perceived threats. Experts say the likelihood of being injured in an attack is very small compared with many other risks that we face each day, but it is hard to listen to the news and not be affected by the images we see. There are many voices that would caution us to distance ourselves from the world and seek to build our fear of anyone that is different. This is exactly the type of perceptions Wayne Smith sought to eliminate when he boldly suggested sharing a home and hospitality for 5-7 days would allow you to see another person for their common humanity and reach across barriers of religion, language, culture and distance. So, let's keep the vision alive and keep the headlines in perspective. At the same time, it is only smart to be aware of travel conditions that may not only present a danger but could cause delays. Register for the State Departments STEP program so you can be located in an emergency. Stay in touch with friends and family. As always, travel safely and wisely.
