Arizona Outbound Exchange February 15-28, 2014

Applications for the Tucson and Phoenix exchange in February 2014 are now being accepted. The ambassador selections will be made by October 1, 2013.

The cost has not been determined. Discussions are ongoing for possible activities with the two Exchange Directors in Arizona. At present, in addition to the 89th Tucson Rodeo Days' Parade, we may visit the Desert Museum and Garden and Sabbino Canyon in the Tuscon area. In Phoenix, we may tour the Heard Museum, Taliesin West, and the Musical Instrument Museum.

Ambassadors will set their own transportation to Arizona. Ambassadors must be able to climb stadium steps unassisted and to walk unassisted at least one mile on uneven or unpaved footpaths.

Hosting an International Institute of Wisconsin Dinner Experience on June 26, 2013

On Wednesday, June 26th, 2013, Kaye and I hosted dinner for three international visitors from Cuba, Moldova, and Swaziland. It was a Wisconsin themed barbecue dinner with Johnsonville Brats, Oscar Mayer hot dogs and Black Angus prime beef hamburgers on the grill. Morrison Mkhonta, Director of the Information Resource Center (IRC) at the United States Embassy in Mbabane, Swaziland, was intrigued by our large grill and volunteered to do the cooking and he did an outstanding job! Morrison is a forty year old single man who explained the role of their king in relationship to their constitution and the democratic process. Since the king is above the law, it sometimes creates conflicts when his wishes run contrary to the will of the people.

Gladys Marquez, from Havana, Cuba, received a call from her son, who is in Miami, while she was with us. She also has a 13 year old daughter back home in Havana. Gladys shared with us examples of how the relationship between Cuba and the U.S. is warming up and from her perspective it is just a matter of time before it will be normal. Gladys is an Information Resource Center technician in the Public Affairs Office. She joined USINT in 2002 as a switchboard operator and quickly rose through the ranks. Although she liked the homemade apple pie, she chose a la mode with Schoeps New York Vanilla ice cream instead of a wedge of Wisconsin aged cheddar cheese on top.

Tamara Turcan, the youngest of the group, is the Director of the American Resource Center (ARC) at the U.S. Embassy in Chisinau, Moldova, for the past two years and before that she worked for the American Councils for International Education (ACTR/ACCELS) administering exchange programs such as Open World and FLEX. She is a consultant for youth policies and development for the National Youth Council of Moldova. Her English was excellent since she earned her Masters degree in International Studies from the University of Queensland, Australia in 2009 and had many stories to compare and contrast that culture to our own. Tamara enjoyed the side dishes of cole slaw, potato salad, baked beans, etc. because it reminded her of their own cuisine in Moldova. We learned a lot from Tamara on how Moldova has reassured their ethnic Russian minority that they will not join Romania and that the Russians will find equal status as citizens of Moldova.

They all spoke excellent English and had a wonderful sense of humor. Morris was the life of the party when he donned our granddaughter's curly wig that she wears for traditional Irish dancing. We urged him to grow his hair long because he looked so good in it. We hope our paths cross again in the future. A good

time was had by all!
