Open World Legislators Exchange from Ukraine February 1-9, 2013

Friendship Force Wisconsin is hosting a delegation of young

elected and appointed officials from Ukraine. They represent various Ukrainian oblasts, which are the equivalent of states in the US. They are being sponsored by the Open World Program – a program created by Congress to bring young leaders from former Soviet countries to the US to learn about our institutions and system of government.

While in Madison, the eight Ukrainians will study accountable governance. They will have a packed agenda meeting with elected officials at all levels of government, university officials, the press and staff with key non-profit agencies. In response to their special interest requests, we have also arranged for them to visit business incubators, museums, and Dane County's first manure digester as an example of biofuel and alternative energy.



At our January meeting the Board began a discussion of continuing to mail the monthly newsletter. Many other clubs and organizations have changed to internet newsletters and we welcome your input on this matter. We currently print 203 each month for roughly 130 member households, the remainder sent to various organizations. The minimum number to meet criteria for bulk mailing is 200. Dave Dohler sends an email message to all members and organizations for whom we have an email address when it is posted on the Internet. In 2012, the cost to our club was \$1,187.50 for printing, \$190.00 for the bulk mail account and \$300.00 for the bulk mail permit for a total charge of \$1,677.50. In 2011 the total charge was \$1,684.08 so we can assume 2013 cost will be similar. It is important that we maintain regular communication with our membership in a format acceptable to everyone. Before considering any change, it would help to hear from our membership, particularly those whose only means of receiving the newsletter is the US Mail, and those who have come to depend on receiving the printed copy and want it continued. The board has an obligation to use our money wisely and it would help to know how many would be satisfied with relying on the internet copy alone.
