International Conference Report--Thinking Outside the Box: Professional Exchanges

Mature clubs such as the Friendship Force of Wisconsin tend to think in terms of traditional exchanges but the world is changing. Many of the Midwestern Clubs do not receive incoming international exchanges. This is true of Wisconsin this year. Our only incoming international exchange has been canceled. Fortunately, we are participating in a themed exchange on Art and Architecture so we will have international guests for several days. Professional programs are becoming increasingly important to many clubs as a method of attracting global visitors.

There are many examples of professional programs that are being conducted in our area. Milwaukee hosted an Eco change, teacher exchanges are providing teachers from around the world with training in English, Computer Science, classroom skills, and required continuing education hours. Medical professionals, legal professionals, government officials, and professionals seeking to learn other languages are also visiting Friendship Force Clubs to learn more in their professional areas skills that they can use at home. High School exchange programs have also been conducted. Some of these programs are conducted through the auspices of programs such as Open World and others are simply programs created by Friendship Force members. The Friendship Force of Wisconsin participated in an Open World program last year hosting young government officials from the Ukraine.

Because these programs are a departure from our usual exchanges they take some work to develop but they also offer exciting opportunities for us to share in new ways. If you have expertise in a particular area or if you are simply interested and passionate about a particular subject let the board members know!!! Perhaps you like to create a language program, a program for teachers, medical programs, sustainable energy, share our natural environment? The opportunities are virtually unlimited.
