Monday, February12: 2:15 p.m., meet at the Dane County Regional Airport to greet ambassadors. 5:30 p.m., welcome dinner at Imperial Gardens (2039 Allen Blvd. Middleton). (*Required sign-up on reservation form.*)

Tuesday, February 13: Time to be determined, Olbrich Gardens/ Olbrich Park sledding (3330 Atwood Ave., Madison) A choice or possible to do both activities. The bridge to the Thai Building will be open at Olbrich. Sledding across the street at Olbrich Park. **11:00 a.m., soup lunch,** Plymouth UCC Church (2401 Atwood Ave.) After lunch, bowling at Dream Lanes, (13 Atlas Ct. Madison 53714) two games for \$3.25 and \$3.00 for shoe rental, pay directly to Dream Lanes. (*No sign-up required, come and have fun.*)
