Back in the beginning of Friendship Force an Exchange had around 500 participants. There were 250 Ambassadors from the US that traveled to another country for a new cultural experience, while at the same time another 250 Ambassadors from that country came to our club. As time passed, the exchanges became smaller to around 20 - 30 Ambassadors. Today they have new programs called Global Exchanges.

A Global Exchange is an exchange where anyone in the world may participate. An example is the Great Lakes Eco-Exchange which was hosted by FF of Greater Milwaukee (FFGM). Participants began their exchange with a home hosting by the Chicago club and then moved on to the Milwaukee club with different eco-related themes each day. The exchange finished by staying in cabins along Lake Michigan that were owned by various members of FFGM.

Wouldn't it be wonderful to develop a theme and host a **Global Exchange here in Madison**? I would love to hear your ideas for a Global Exchange. Let's come up with something to showcase our beautiful city and state. We could also combine the exchange with other clubs in our area. If you would like to help regenerate our club, come forward and help us to "Attract International Exchanges". Give me a call with all your ideas. There are no bad ideas.
