Book: Lenora: The Buried Story of Guadeloupe

Columbus was the first European to land on this island on his second voyage in 1493. The Spanish tried to colonize the island but the fearsome Carib Indians repelled them. The French succeeded in 1635 and eliminated the Caribs. The French brought in African slaves to work the sugar plantations. Leonora grew up in the black, post-slave, French and Creole speaking culture. Leonora tells us a lot about family life, school for the children, religion, love, marriage, and relationships outside of marriage. She talks with mixed feelings about France and the French language vs Creole.

Delegates from Ukraine Topic: Media Literacy

The Open World Leadership Center is an independent government agency of the United States Congress. The center sponsors and funds the Open World Program which brings emerging leaders from mostly Eurasian countries to the United States in order to give them firsthand exposure to the American system of participatory democracy and free enterprise.

The Friendship Force-Wisconsin-Madison has been invited to participate in the Open World Program for 2017. Our assigned topic will be Media Literacy - meaning the ability of audiences to think critically and objectively analyze data—as a key way to withstand the information war, lies, and hate speech. Our delegates will be from Ukraine. According to the preliminary information, Ukraine has been flooded with disinformation that divides, confuses, and destabilizes. Our assignment is to develop 32 hours of programing where delegations will work with seasoned journalists and media professionals to see how they expose false reporting/information and search for objectivity (or explain the role of bias). Our programming is also to help them learn how society can be better prepared to think critically, check facts, and respond to disinformation in effective ways.

We will need seven home hosts. We are assuming that we will very likely rent a 15-passenger van to transport our delegates to and from various programming locations which means we will need people willing to drive the van. If you have any connections to people that are in the media or would have specific programming knowledge in this area, please let us know. Committee members welcome! We do have a number of initial ideas but additional contact information is welcome.
