The Norderstedt Exchange is scheduled for Monday, September 19 – Monday, September 26.

### Turkey in 2011 Wisconsin to Urla of Greater Izmir, Turkey September 27 - October 15

Turkey is surrounded on three sides by water. To the north is the Black Sea; to the south the Mediterranean Sea; and to the west is the Aegean Sea. Then there is the great Sea of Marmara and the Bosporus and Dardanelles Straits.

All of this water gives Turkey about 4, 475 miles of coastline. Be sure to bring your swimmer.
