# Russia September 2012

Still thinking about Russia? The itinerary is falling into place; we are building a list of ambassadors. If you are still thinking of applying, now is the time. We still have room for a few more ambassadors. Call or Email me and I will send you an application.

We plan to depart the first week in September 2012. Our package includes the bus to/from Chicago, the flight to and from Europe and transfer to Moscow. We will be home hosted seven nights in Moscow where Natalia Guskova, the Moscow Exchange Director is preparing a very busy itinerary. We will travel by metro to visit sites throughout Moscow and the surrounding area. We will then hop the train for St. Petersburg where we will be met by an English speaking guide. We will tour the famous sites in the city including the Hermitage, St. Isaacs's cathedral, and the Peter Paul fortress and we are planning a boat tour on the river Neva through the center of St. Petersburg. It offers wonderful views of the city. The trip to St. Petersburg will also offer two days touring by motor coach where we will visit, among other things, the beautiful Peterhof palace which is often referred to as the Russian equivalent of Versailles. You will be amazed at its ornate beauty. After we complete our tour in St. Petersburg, we will be transported by bus to Vyborg. Plans include a boat tour, tour of the castle, Peters Hill, an excursion to the park, great food and entertainment. We will stay in Vyborg two nights and then transfer to the airport for our return home. English speaking guides are planned throughout. We are still negotiating with tour companies and making adjustments to the itinerary but at the present time, it appears that the trip will include breakfast each day and most if not all dinners. Tips are being built into the pricing and the \$200-\$250 cost of the Russian visa is included.

I am estimating that the cost will be \$4,200. Because of currency exchange fluctuations, the exact prices for some items will not be available until we are closer to departure. Members of the Dubuque club that visited this area last year said we are in for a real treat. So don't let this one pass you by. If you have ever considered traveling to Russia, this is your opportunity.

The second Exchange is an inbound Exchange from Trujillo Peru. They are very excited about visiting us here in Madison. Many of the Ambassadors speak some English.

Friday after we have dessert with the Ambassadors and their FF Greater Milwaukee hosts, our hosts will bring their guests home. We will go to a fish fry that evening. Saturday we will go to the Farmers' Market with an introduction by Director Larry Johnson. Food Explorers will guide us as we eat our way from Monona Terrace to the UW Student Union Later we will meet at the State Historical Society for a native American dinner along with a tour.
