FRIENDSHIP FORCE WISCONSIN CLUB PIN DESIGN

When the ambassadors from Oregon and St. Louis visited our club last June, they each presented me as the Exchange Director with their club pin. It was then I realized that our club doesn't have a pin and I could not reciprocate.

Last fall the Board of Directors gave me the authorization to design a pin for their consideration. I met with artist, Jane Scharer, also a club member and we brainstormed four or five designs. The Board selected one, and I worked with a professional, Camron Lewis, who produced the pin in the format needed for the manufacturer and designed our state capitol dome image. We could not find an appropriate image in viewing several hundred models available. Wisconsin's dome is unique.



I researched costs with various companies and found Advertising Premium Sales offered us the best price overall. The design shown here was approved by the Board of Directors on February 15 and authorized placing a production order for 1,000 pins. The selling price will be determined after we have all the costs including shipping charges.

Our pin follows the International Friendship Force guidelines for the six-color logo and the style of the wording in the center of the pin which will be in black. The beautiful capitol dome will also be in black and the word "Madison" beneath it will be in red. The background of the pin will be in a soft white, and the entire pin will be cut in the shape of the State of Wisconsin. The pin's outline will be in silver and will have a squeeze clutch and nail on the back of the pin for easily attaching to fabric. It will not be framed in a square as shown in the illustration here.

We hope that you are excited at this news that the Friendship Force of Wisconsin will now have its own pin for incoming and outbound exchange ambassadors to share and that you will purchase and proudly wear our own new club pin!
