Cleveland Co, England Exchange May 11 – 18, 2016

Area Information

Our outbound exchange to Cleveland County, England will take us to Stockton Borough. Stockton Borough consists of the market Town of Stockton, plus the smaller towns and surrounding villages. Stockton is an Anglo Saxon name – the 'ton' ending means farm or homestead. Stockton can trace its market history back to 1310. The Industrial Revolution changed Stockton from a small town to a flourishing center of heavy industry initially iron, steel, and shipbuilding and later chemicals.

In 1822, the first rail of the Stockton and Darlington railway was laid thus beginning a new era in trade, industry and travel, and the first passenger railway in the world. The heavy industry is gone and has been replaced with smaller works and call centers. The port of Tees, five miles down River, still has a thriving oil and chemical industry.

Stockton is well placed for exploring one of the most beautiful areas of England. Within a 15 minute drive to the South are the Cleveland Hills and North York Moors – a great expanse of moor land and green valleys. The coastal area is spectacular and has many small fishing villages. The most famous and largest is the town of Whitby – home of Captain Cooke – and the best fish and chips in the U.K. It was one of the main fishing and whaling ports in the 19th Century.

We are looking forward to getting to know our hosts and learning more about the area.

Every 12 years, Nashik plays host to the grand Kumbh Mela, the largest religious gathering on earth (the last one was in 2015, the next one in 2027). Nashik is well known for the cultivation of onions, grapes and tomatoes. The city has long remained an important center for the growth of table grapes. Hence the city is also called the Wine Capital of India.

A Nation Divided: America's Civil War Dates: 9/20/16 – 10/9/16 Themed Global Exchange



Experience a historical adventure on this 20-day exchange where you will learn about both sides of America's Civil War. Five Friendship Force Clubs from the Northeast/Mid-Atlantic Region of the USA will host this exchange. We begin in Harrisburg, PA, (5 nights) spend a night in a hotel on the way to Charleston, WV, (2 nights), move to Charlottesville, VA (4 nights), then to Richmond, VA (4 nights), and end in Washington, DC (4 nights). Cost is \$2075.

The itinerary includes a variety of Civil War related sights and discussion of issues including battlefields, museums, cemeteries, a farm, a plantation, Harper's Ferry, places used as hospitals, lectures on medicine, the underground railroad, important battles, generals, and other leaders including Lincoln. Several of the presentations will be made by National Park Guides.
