Outbound Exchange to Malang, Samarinda and Bali, Indonesia August 31-September 18, 2013

Indonesia, the fourth most populous country in the world, consists of over 17,500 islands of which only 6,000 are inhabited; it has a population of 240 million people in over 350 ethnic groups.

We will get acquainted with the exotic blend of cultures, learn about Javanese traditional music, fruits/plants, test our bargaining skills at a village bazaar, learn the legend of the Coban Rondo Waterfall, and enjoy the Dutch architecture of the Mulawarman Museum. This museum in Samarinda is in a 1930s palace where 19 sultans reigned and lived. It has a Balinese puppet theatre.

At the Pampang Cultural Village in Samarinda, we will see Dayak dancers. We can pay to have our pictures taken in traditional clothing or with Dayak people and purchase local products and souvenirs. In Malang, sometimes called "Paris of East Java," there are ten senior highs, 13 colleges and universities and two international schools. We will visit the Wonosari Tea Plantation and the Baku Secret Zoo. We will spend a night at Mount Bromo, a well known tourist attraction, with an active volcano in the Tenyger Semeru National Park. We will leave our Indonesian hosts to spend several days in Bali before returning home.

Estimated Price: \$1800 US dollars. Includes FFI and host fees. Does not include international airfare.
