On the form, please let me know if you plan on flying or will be driving and are looking for traveling companions.

The Medicine Hat Host Coordinator has provided the following list of some of the kinds of activities they have done in the past when they have hosted journeys: Medalta Clay Museum, Hutterite Colony tour, City Hall tour, Leisure Center tour, lawn and five-pin bowling, raising of a tee pee activity, Prairie Gleaners tour and "hands on" freeze dried vegetables demo, and Stations of the Cross tour all made by a local brick artist. The cost for the seven-day journey is estimated at approximately \$150.00. That does not include the FFI fee or travel costs.

Medicine Hat is located in the prairie lands of Alberta province, 183 miles southeast of Calgary. Anyone flying would fly into Calgary and the host club would make arrangements at your expense to be transported to Medicine Hat. If driving to Medicine Hat, it is a 20 hour trip one way.

Get a friend or two together and take a few additional days either on the front end of the journey or following the journey. Discover the treasurers of North Dakota or Montana's Glacier National Park or explore Regina, Saskatchewan or Winnipeg, Manitoba in Canada.


