The 2009 Mystery Trip

Our Club received a \$1900 credit from Amtrak. Apparently not everything went as expected on our trip to Montana. The money was a credit and needed to be spent by the end of September 2009. Mary Lindquist contacted Gene Dewey and that set the wheels in motion. They were actually train wheels in motion. Gene made all the contacts and arrangements and the trip was set for Saint Louis, Missouri.

Twenty-five Friendship Force Ambassadors drove to Columbus and got on Amtrak for another Mystery Trip. Our departure was scheduled for 1:00 pm and we got to Saint Louis via Chicago around midnight.

On our first day, we visited "The Hill". It is a small area of Saint Louis that retains its Italian heritage and roots to the max. We visited a small local ravioli factory, Mama Toscano's, that produces 6000 ravioli per day and ships them all over the country. We played Bocce Ball in a large indoor rink, visited the local Saint Ambrose Catholic church for a concert, and ate lunch at a great Italian restaurant, Favazza's. We also visited the Missouri Bakery. The Italians are doing a great job in maintaining their culture and community spirit. They really help each other in many different ways. The rest of the afternoon was free time with our hosts.

On Saturday, we visited the restored Fox Theater. It seats over 4000 people and was built in the late 1920's. The word grandeur could be used here as well as magnificent. We then went to tour the Catholic Basilica of Saint Louis. It was awe inspiring and beautiful. There is over 83000 square feet of mosaics covering the walls and ceiling of the church The afternoon was again free time with out hosts.

On Sunday we had a farewell brunch and then the group toured Grants Farm. It belongs to the Anheiser Busch and is a fun place for families to visit. There are lots of animal exhibits and demonstrations, and over 1000 free ranging animals on the acreage. There were lots of deer, buffalo, turkeys etc.

The free time with the hosts was spent in a variety of ways. Some Ambassadors visited the "Arch", a must stop. Others went to the Art museum, Cahokia Mounds, and other museums, etc. Some of the Ambassadors had the opportunity to see the Phantom of the Opera at the Fox Theater.

The hosts were gracious. They provided us with a great variety of venues which painted a great picture of Saint Louis. We made many new friends and shared different life experiences. It was a very enjoyable trip and we are all enriched by the experience.

Gene Dewey has done it again and has pulled off another memorable mystery trip. It takes time, knowledge, patience and a little luck to pull these trips off. Gene has been the planner, organizer, and exchange director for five great mystery trips. If he was a football team, he would be 5 and. 0.
