A NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Whew! We have finished a busy exchange season. In May we traveled to Cleveland County UK. In July, we hosted Nashik Riverside, India and in September, we hosted Santa Barbara and Winnipeg. I know that we all enjoyed hosting and being hosted but those of us who have been active in all of the exchanges and on the various committees are ready for a break. Having said that, plans are well underway for our trip to Guadeloupe in February.

I want to thank Bernie Long, Joan Calkins and Kay Babcock for sharing their stories about the early days of the Friendship Force. We had about 40 members and several potential members at the general membership meeting on October 18. Feedback has been very positive. Thanks to Lucy Lasseter we were able to arrange to have the meeting videotaped by Fitchburg Community Television. We will receive copies of the tape for our records.

When I asked Bernie, Joan and Kay whether they felt they had made a difference, they agreed that their trips to countries like Russia and Cuba definitely had an impact. Madison traveled to Russia in 1983 when the Cold War was particularly intense. This was a year when the nuclear early warning system falsely reported the launch of intercontinental missiles from the US twice. We traveled to West Berlin in 1987 which was the year that Reagan call for the Soviet leaders to "Tear down this wall". We traveled to Czechoslovakia in 1988 at the beginning of Perestroika. In 1988 and 1989 we traveled to the USSR and Lithuania as part of the A.R.M.S (American Russian Mutual Survival) program. Kay shared her experiences from Cuba during the Castro era. Of course we also traveled to more comfortable and safe countries like England, Switzerland, Brazil and Germany but it does raise the question of where would you travel today to have the greatest impact on world peace?

The board has submitted our outbound exchange requests for 2018. Our requests are South Africa, Japan, Chile, and India. I think it is exciting that all of our choices are visits to cultures that are distinctly different than our own. If we receive one or more of these assignments, 2018 will offer some very interesting opportunities.

Exchange Coordinator Report

We have now completed our 2016 exchanges: outbound to Florida Club of Greater Orlando March 11-18 coordinated by Nancy Brown; international outbound to Cleveland County, England May 11-18 with co-EDs Nancy Brown and Stephanie Sorensen; international inbound from Nashik Riverside Club, India July 8-15 with ED Helen Ann Rugowski and Asst. ED Jerry Fuller; and international inbound from Winnipeg, Canada and Santa Barbara, CA September 13-20 with co-ed's Patrick Fleming and George Wysock.

The 2017 exchange schedule is finalized! We begin with the outbound international exchange to Guadeloupe February 22-March 1, 2017. Co-Ed's Maureen Kind and Lise Skofronick are corresponding with the Guadeloupe ED. Ambassador interviews have been held and we are awaiting word whether the Guadeloupe club can host more than 20 ambassadors.

San Diego inbound reciprocal exchange is scheduled for May 19-26, 2017 and they anticipate 20 ambassadors. The international inbound exchange from Noumea, New Caledonia is June 23-29 following their exchange with the Chicago club June 18-23. Anticipate the number of ambassadors to be between 15-20. Both these exchanges were approved at the October board meeting.

Peg Hutnik has been approved to be one of the EDs for one of the weeks of our outbound exchange to Medicine Hat, Canada August 8-14 and Metro Vancouver, Canada August 14-22.

A number of domestic clubs have expressed an interest in coming to Madison: Denver, Colorado in spring or fall, Western North Carolina with about 10 ambassadors, and a reciprocal with Lower Columbia in Washington.

The exchange with Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada and Santa Barbara, California was a great success as evidenced by the fact that we came out in the black and the evaluations were very positive. Our treasurer, Lois Schulz, reported that we had \$189.13 left over after all the bills were paid.

Although the evaluations were very glowing, we can still learn from their feedback. We had a very diverse group of people in the two groups, i.e. Americans from California and international visitors from Canada. The ages varied a great deal but there were many veteran Friendship Force travelers in both groups, which gave them the advantage of comparing this exchange with others. We realize we could have done a better job of mixing the two groups together during their stay. It really helped the planning committee when the ambassadors let us know their interests ahead of time. What one group found very interesting, the other group might not have rated as high such as ABS. We always struggle with how much free time our guests want and need to spend with their host families or just resting and relaxing on their own, especially older ambassadors. We saw the need to do more to educate the group prior to the event so they would have a better appreciation for the presentations such as Frank Lloyd Wright and the Unitarian Society. The quality of the guides makes a big difference also. Both guides at the International Crane Foundation were fantastic and the evaluations reflected that.

Our committee wants to thank all of the host families, the day hosts and those who were instrumental in scheduling the events for your efforts. We couldn't have done it without you!
