Standing Committees

Chairperson is a member of the FFW Board, attends the monthly meetings and has voting rights.

Activities - Chairperson - Fannie Hicklin - Responsible for planning, arranging and conducting the general activities of FFW, scheduling the three major activities which are: Annual Business Meeting and Luncheon in spring, Summer Picnic and Fall Festival. The committee coordinates additional activities planning an activity at least every other month. Work with the Exchange Directors in planning activities for current and future exchanges or help celebrate the closing of a successful exchange.

Communications - Chairperson - Dave Dohler - Responsible for communications with the general public. Work with Exchange Directors to help publicize upcoming exchanges and proactively advertise the general activities of our club. Create articles to be published in newspapers, local magazines and the website for activities and exchange meetings, such as interview sessions and workshops. Maintain a directory of publications with deadlines to share with Exchange Directors and Activity Chairs.

Historian - Chairperson - Margo Lindl - Responsible for maintaining the FFW historical records from inception. This includes records from membership, minutes from board meetings, exchanges records, Treasurer's records, newsletters and other documents related to the management of our club.

Membership - Chairperson - Maggie Dohm - Responsible for maintaining a database of members. From this database print labels for newsletters, renewal notices, reports for committee volunteers and other reports as requested. Send information to prospective members and send new members a welcome packet consisting of current newsletter & membership roster.

Newsletter - Chairperson - Janet Lonergan Responsible for creating and editing the newsletter from the articles received from the president, committee chairs, members and other newsworthy sources, responsible for obtaining other articles to print in our newsletter. Coordinate the printing, labeling and mailing of the newsletter on a timely basis.

Outreach - Chairperson - Margie Groom - Responsible for reaching out to other individuals, organizations and the general public in the Madison area. The committee will be the central location for information about presentations. It will also seek out

new places to present information about Friendship Force of Wisconsin. It will coordinate requests for presentations, also keep a record of places for presentations and include contact information. It will work with other committees to share upcoming club information.

Store/Name Badges - Chairpersons - Rad & Susan Becker -

Responsible for obtaining Wisconsin items and other items suitable for exchange gifts for members participating in an exchange, or for gifts for members who are hosting. The committee will provide the store for workshops and other activities as necessary. The committee is also responsible for maintaining financial records, ordering and delivering name badges.

Special Committees

Chairpersons should attend board meetings; report on the plans for an activity and on its completion. Chair does not have voting rights but is. welcome at a 11 board meetings.

FFW on the Capital Square - Bea Dewey - Responsible for organizing a group of volunteers to staff the table at the Capital Square Farmers' Market on Saturdays from the middle of May through October. Coordinate with the Capital Police in the spring to secure a spot for the season. Report to the board after each activity.

WISCONSIN RETURNS FROM AZERBAIJAN

All twenty ambassadors to Azerbaijan are safely home, on schedule! Jane Kessenich and Lise Skofronick extended their travel to Russia and Hungary but are now home. Two of our group are from Alabama.

It is difficult to access an Exchange as we each bring home an assortment of experiences, even though we shared some sights and events. I can only speak for myself As always, the Exchanges boil down to the people involved, some very indirectly.

Our FFW ambassadors were wonderful representatives of FFW. Three were on their first Exchange with us. What troopers! Probably we all agree that we practiced flexibility, with a flair. It's amazing how we create our own little family, brushing teeth together, sharing rooms, crushing bodies together in the small back seat of a taxi etc. The host families and the members in charge of arranging our stay could not have treated us better. They were sensitive to our needs, often rearranging plans so that we would be more comfortable. As an aside, two of our group were "debating" who had the better host.

The Azaris were eager to share their history, culture, foods, and industry. Specifically, we visited Baku, the capital city, Sheki, and Gakh (the last two located in the Caucasus Mountains.) Total strangers would inquire about our impressions of Azerbaijan, then observe how much they "like Americans." How nice to know that we are liked. Not everyone was a stranger.

At our February workshop Parvin Ahanchi, a native of Azerbaijan, shared information about her homeland We all met her again in Baku at the Welcome Party and at the Conference. At the Conference a representative from the US Embassy asked us "to tell people about little Azerbaijan." We will. How could we not when we were treated so well, countless hugs and kisses as bonuses?

Then there was young Rashad, who heard me on a bus and followed us to my host's apartment building. He wanted to speak American English. He spent the next day at a Conference, fulfilling his desire to practice American English with us. He took me home to meet his Mother, a former English teacher, to show me his English books (Stephen King, Steinbeck etc.) and, yes, to serve food and tea while speaking American English. I hope you can come to the Fall Festival November 8 to share with the other 17 FFW ambassadors. I know others will eagerly share their experiences. We plan to have you view, listen, and taste our experiences with us. Azerbaijan is a country of which many seem unaware. Let us acquaint you a bit with this small country with many big hearted people.

Finally, I wish to thank all the FFW members who helped set up the plans for this Exchange. Between them, very helpful and cooperative Ambassadors, and the energetic, hard working Azerbaijan members, I hope we have successfully made new, significant friendships.
