Dear Fellow Members,

Thank you for your past support in being a member of The Friendship Force of Wisconsin, Inc. We appreciate your support, no matter how small or big. It takes many members to make a club function well. Your past support has been appreciated.

Your membership in Friendship Force brings the world to your door step.
