2012 WISCONSIN EXCHANGE TO RUSSIA

Information about the upcoming exchange to Russia is becoming more available. We will be home hosted for two weeks: one in Moscow and one in a newly minted club in Vyborg.

Vyborg is a city 38 kilometers from the Finnish border and about 130 kilometers north of St. Petersburg. The city was part of medieval Sweden, has been part of Finland and was most recently ceded to Russia in 1944. Our visit there should be fascinating.

Since we are going through St. Petersburg we will spend some time touring there probably between the home stays. So if you are interested in visiting Vyborg and would like to see both Moscow and St. Petersburg this is your opportunity!!!

Tentative plans are to conduct interviews and take applications in February. The exchange is planned for September 2012 but exact dates will have to be worked out with both of the Russian clubs.
