

Our bylaws require a quorum of 25% of the membership in attendance in order to hold the meeting. A detailed meeting agenda will be sent along with the ZOOM link in advance of the meeting. Additional meeting information follows.

Detailed bios were included in the March newsletter for President, Vice President and Treasurer candidates.

Here is John Witte's bio.

John Witte is Professor Emeritus of Political Science and Public Affairs at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He was previously Director of the Robert La Follette School of Public Affairs at UW. Following three years as a naval officer, he received his Ph.D. in political science from Yale University in 1978. His research has focused primarily on tax and education policy, including school choice, vouchers and charter schools.

CLUB ANNUAL MEETING

Following his 2012 retirement, John has served as founding dean (2010) of the School of Sciences and Humanities (SSH) of Nazarbayev University in Astana Kazakhstan. The SSH programs are designed to train leaders in all aspects of social development to have versatile knowledge in the field of social, liberal and natural sciences. SSH teaches its students to solve intellectual challenges they may encounter in their life and career regardless of their career choice.

John and his wife Mary have been members of the Friendship Force for ten years and have home hosted journey ambassadors and Open World delegates. They have also participated in outgoing journeys, most recently to Guadeloupe.

Proposed Bylaws Change:

The board recommends a change to our club's bylaws, to be voted on at the Annual Meeting on April 27. The proposed by-law adds another standing committee, *Electronic Communications*, to our board.

The current standing committees are Membership, Activities, Outreach and Programs. The Electronic Communications Committee has been an ad hoc committee for the past two years. Since the committee's role is expected to continue long into the future, the board is proposing that it be changed to a standing committee. Making such a change requires the approval of 2/3 of the members in attendance at the meeting. The proposed addition to Article VII Committees and Appointees, Section 1 of the bylaws is as follows:

"E. Electronic Communications: Manage and maintain electronic communications media such as the club website, social media sites, Zoom and MailChimp. Train users and identify evolving technology to enhance communications."

MIKE AND CARLA DI IORIO

Mike and Carla to join FF-Wisconsin based on their love of travel and their interest in learning about other and countries experience diverse cultures. They have hosted dinners for ambassadors and for Open World guests from Russia and India. Mike and Carla look forward to participating in future events with the FF-Wisconsin Club.

While they have not yet traveled with FF Wisconsin, Mike and Carla have traveled extensively with Overseas Adventure Travel (OAT) to places such as India, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Turkey, Morocco, Egypt, Tanzania, South Africa, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Zambia, and Costa Rica.

Mike and Carla's OAT group was one of the first allowed into Egypt after its 2011 pro-democracy revolution. Their tour guide had been a pro-democracy activist and protester, who shared personal experiences and insights into the revolution, along with information on Egyptian history and politics.

At times Mike and Carla's travel experiences were more unusual and frightening than educational. Snakes seem to be a theme of these adventures. When visiting a small village in southern India, the mayor hired a cobra catcher to entertain visitors. Mike and Carla are convinced the cobra looked them straight in their eyes and was moving toward them before it was caught! When in Thailand, they visited Phuket and toured Monkey Island. The ride to the island was extremely rough because they were seated in the speedboat's bow. Not only was the ride rough, but while swimming off Monkey Island, they had to jump into the boat to avoid poisonous snakes in the water.

Their first self-planned trip was to Germany with their three sons. The boys were in their early teens and curious to learn about Germany and their heritage. They loved meeting German people and had many opportunities to practice their German language skills. This family car trip proved a life-changing experience for their sons, and it inspired "the boys" to continue traveling into their adult lives. One of Mike and Carla's sons accompanied them on a trip to Turkey. He provided historical background and became an extra (and expert) guide when they were in Ephesus. As Mike commented, "It was wonderful to learn from our son about this city's history."

Not surprisingly, Mike and Carla have upcoming trips planned with OAT; they hope Covid does not prevent them from going to Northern Italy and Southern France and participating in another African safari in 2022. In addition, they would like to visit Prague, Berlin, and Vienna.

Before retiring, Carla was a reference librarian at the Madison Central Library for forty years. Mike worked in computer design for many years and then radically shifted his career to study nursing. Since their retirement, both have been active in PLATO. They cochair PLATO's special events committee and are responsible for planning lectures, social events, and field trips to concerts, plays, gardens, historical sites and nature conservatories. In addition, both are volunteer gardeners at Olbrich Gardens and audit classes at UW-Madison. They especially enjoy auditing history courses about countries that they hope to visit.
