Japan and Australia Inbound Journey

From August 24 to 31st, we will host twenty-one ambassadors from the Oita, Japan and Tweed Valley, Australia Friendship Force clubs - sixteen from Japan and five from Australia. Members of our club were previously hosted by both clubs in 2018 and 2019, respectively. An active itinerary is planned, including visits to Olbrich Gardens, the International Crane Foundation, Devil's Lake, Wollersheim Winery, Cedar Grove Cheese Factory, Hinchley Dairy Farm, the State Capitol and UW's Chazen Museum.

A welcome picnic is planned for Friday, August 25, at Warner Park. The Farewell event will be combined with our club's annual summer picnic at Vilas Park on Wednesday, August 30. Friendship Force members are welcome to participate in any of these activities. Details and sign up forms will be included in the June newsletter.

Other ways for you to participate include hosting ambassadors in your home, accompanying ambassadors to activities in lieu of the home host, and/or hosting a small group dinner at your home. Second Harvest Foodbank

The Farm to Foodbank initiative began by asking a relatively simple question: how can we provide more locally-produced nutritious food to those facing hunger and help area growers and food producers at the same time? During the pandemic, more families struggled with job loss and economic hardship, and local growers and food producers faced devastating setbacks due to the loss of their traditional sales and distribution outlets.

Kick-started by Federal pandemic-relief funds, Second Harvest set up a network of local food growers and producers in Dane County, purchasing and delivering tens of millions of pounds of nutritious food to the tables of neighbors needing food support.

Monetary contributions to Second Harvest support 16 counties in southwestern Wisconsin.

The Farm to Foodbank Initiative will:

- Purchase nutritious items like vegetables, fruits, eggs, and milk and provide them to our neighbors looking for food support
- Help local farmers plan for the future, knowing they have a reliable outlet for their product
- Infuse funds into the local economy by supporting local farming operations

FRESH, LOCAL FOOD FOR EVERYONE

Our Madison club volunteers at the end of each month. We sort, package, and generally prepare bulk food into smaller proportions for distribution by the Foodbank.

We're planning for a warm sunny day to dine outdoors on the patio at the North and South Seafood and Smokehouse Restaurant.

We'll enjoy selections from their menu of appetizers, soups and salads, tacos and sandwiches (\$11.50 - \$14.50). The Smokehouse offers ribs, Texas brisket, Memphis pulled pork, Carolina chicken breast, burnt ends, nine combos; and all entrees include two sides.

Fish entrees are haddock, cod, perch, catfish, salmon, and whitefish with crab stuffing. There are five styles of shrimp and you can choose one or two styles — hand battered, scampi, firecracker, grilled, or coconut — for \$16. New Orleans jambalaya is \$18, and the Smokin' Saturday special is smoked prime rib for \$25/\$31/\$45 plus an old fashioned drink. There is a full bar for beverage choices.

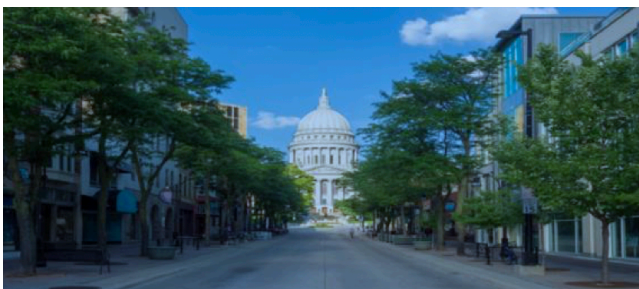

Welcome & Introduction of New Members

Kathy Speck called the business part of the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, with a delightful welcome and presentation of photos and mini-bios of the four new members who had joined since our last annual meeting in 2021:

Present: A quorum of the members was present.

**Approval of Minutes from Previous
Annual Meeting in April 2021**

- George Wysock and Donna Ulteig respectively moved to accept and second the minutes from the 2021 annual meeting. Gail Holmes noted there was no secretary's signature on the minutes. The minutes had been produced by a group effort, but Diana Rodum, who was secretary at the time of the meeting, agreed to sign them. The minutes passed unanimously with Ms. Rodum's signature added

Treasurer's Report for 2021-22

- Mary Juckem said she had deducted the donations received for the Afghan refugees from both the income and expenditures to accurately reflect the club's true financial status. She said that she had missed a 50 cent expenditure, which would then result in a net loss of \$93.11. She revised the report to reflect the difference. The club balance at the end of the year was \$16,653.63 for all accounts.
- Agnes Rona moved and Sandi Wysock seconded that the financial report be accepted with the minor change noted. The motion passed unanimously.

President's Report

President Kathy Speck said:

- Friendship Force International had to cancel all journeys for 2020 and 2021, but it survived the pandemic with a skeleton staff. It developed a new portal for members, which contains a lot of virtual cultural programs. It has also begun to schedule journeys for 2022 and 2023.
- Friendship Force WI had to cancel all incoming journeys, and the outgoing journeys were also cancelled. However, the club continued to be active with many virtual and some in-person activities and a lot of member involvement.

Election of Officers

Sandi Wysock presented the slate of candidates recommended by the Nominations Committee

Bylaws Change

President Speck recommended that Article VII Committees and Appointees, Section 1 of the bylaws be amended to add Electronics Communications Committee as a committee of the Board, as follows:

Electronic Communications: Manage and maintain electronic communications media such as the club website, social media sites, Zoom and MailChimp. Train users and identify evolving technology to enhance communications.

John Witte moved and Gail Holmes seconded that the amendment be added. The motion passed unanimously.

Journey Coordinator

Stephanie Sorensen, Journey Manager, reported the following:

- Friendship Force International has made numerous changes and is trying to reschedule cancelled journeys from the past two years.
- We have been offered an incoming journey from Japan and an outgoing to New Zealand.
- Members have shown an interest in going to Olympia WA. However, she will need two coordinators for the trip – one experienced and one learner.
- We have been offered an incoming journey from Mexico during Thanksgiving week, but this will depend on whether there are sufficient people to host that week. Anyone able to host should let her know.
- The incoming bike journey is on hold.
- There will be an Open World program group coming in the fall from Kazakhstan.
- New Caledonia is out, but Dallas TX is a possibility.
- Members were urged to be journey coordinators or hosts.
- Anyone interested in other journeys should check the Friendship Force International website for outbound journeys with other clubs. Often, there is room for a couple people on the outgoing journeys.

- President Speck urged the members to check the website events calendar to be aware of all upcoming events.
- Davis Blado said to note the changed dates for Tom & Donna Miller's presentation about Ukraine and Donna Ulteig's about the Chernobyl Centers.
- Donna Ulteig noted that the reference to Friends of Chernobyl Centers US (FOCCUS) was incorrect on the website.
- Gail Holmes thanked those who led the various club activities and discussed the upcoming activities. She reported that Maureen Kind will be leading the "Let's Walk, Let's Hike" group; Kathy Martinson will be coordinating the Second Harvest activity; and Vivian Norton will help with bike rides.
- Mike Lambert said that some international graduate students are willing to give a presentation about their country. An upcoming Zoom meeting is scheduled to hear about Korea. He also noted that he and his co-chair, David Blado, intend to continue trivia programs throughout the summer.

Agnes Rona told the group that she wants to give up her job as editor of the newsletter and needs a replacement. She said the group may have to consider some changes, such as having co-editors or only publishing every other month. Anyone interested in the position should contact her or the chair.
