2025 JOURNEYS

Outbound Journey: Brazil – Dates TBD

At the 2024 Annual Meeting, Club President Doug Johnson announced the 2025 outbound journey to two Friendship Force clubs in Brazil.

The city of Belém is in northeast Brazil about 60 miles from the Atlantic Ocean on the Para River, part of the Amazon River system. Nicknamed the “City of Mango Trees,” it has an estimated population of 1.5 million with an additional 1 million living outside the city proper. From all reports there is a lot to see and do in Belém.

Belo Horizonte, population 2.3 million with over 6 million in the greater metro area, was the first planned city in Brazil. Located in the south central part of the country, Belo Horizonte is surrounded by mountains and is known for its parks and the 17 educational institutions in the area. Both cities have international airports.

We have been in contact with both clubs and are waiting for more details on tentative dates and the number of Ambassadors they can host.

Outbound Journey: Birmingham – Date TBD

Our club has been assigned to travel to Birmingham, Alabama, as our domestic outbound journey next year.

The host club has 42 members and can host between 10 and 15 Ambassadors. Typical things to see are the Civil Rights Museum, Botanical Gardens, the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame, Barber Motor Sports, the Sloss Furnace from its days as an iron and steel town, plus parks and art galleries.

At this time, no dates have been set for this journey.

One participant (Gail) wrote, "All of us found that reading it was fascinating and historically interesting as the original haggadah (traditional Jewish literature, especially the non-legal part of the Talmud) was physically moved from country to country and sequestered from book burnings and destruction over the centuries."

ACTIVITIES*Second Harvest Foodbank*

Friendship Force volunteers have made a significant impact on the food security of people in southwest Wisconsin as FF members have dedicated hours of volunteer time at the Second Harvest Food Bank on the east side of Madison.

Second Harvest is not only a distribution center, but a community-based service organization collaborating with more than 300 food pantries, schools, after school programs and other non-profit organizations across a 16-county region.

Hundreds of volunteers have worked tirelessly for almost 50,000 hours during the past year to prepare boxes of food to be delivered to the above organizations. This last year, almost 22 million pounds of food was distributed.

But statistics don't tell the whole story:

Friendship Force volunteers have found camaraderie and purpose as they gather at Second Harvest on the **last Wednesday** of each month from **12:30-3:30pm**. They have reaped the rewards of knowing that their time is well spent to make a difference in the lives of people in need. Our "jobs" can include sorting, labeling, and packing food into family-sized portions. We are often joined by other dedicated volunteers as we work together in a committed and joyful atmosphere.

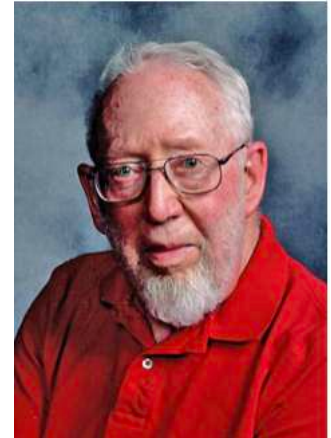

PROGRAMS

A Global Journey to Taiwan
 presented by
Diane Mertens and Larry Neuman

Late last November, Larry and Diane met 19 other Global Ambassadors and several Journey Coordinators from Hsinchu at the train station in Taipei, Taiwan. It was the beginning of an 11-day, memorable Journey, first to Hsinchu, where they met their hosts and spent a day, then to sites along the western length of Taiwan. They stayed close to the coast, stopping at urban areas, at times diverting to parks or mountain villages, everywhere savoring the people, the landscape, and the cultural richness.

And what a cultural feast it was!

They enjoyed a folk opera, visited an ancestor-worshipping temple, explored a Buddhist temple complex, listened to traditional music, and learned about Hakka oil paper umbrellas and dragon dance masks. There were ample opportunities to participate—activities like acting on stage in Taiwanese folk opera, mixing up a special kind of Hakka Lei Tea, donning traditional costumes, and dancing at an indigenous village.

PROGRAMS*Taiwan (cont):*

Along the way came some unusual sights—a valley teeming with millions of wintering, purple butterflies, their flutters filling the air with color; and seaside oyster beds being harvested in a very traditional way— with oxen. (After their ox cart ride, Larry and Diane couldn't resist an opportunity to sample the oysters.)

On Day 10 of their trip—almost the end—their bus took them to an indigenous village close to Hsinchu. There Diane related her favorite activity—touring an elementary school and then listening to a special performance by the school choir. (Music courses were recently introduced, she was told, so that the students could rediscover their traditions and appreciate their ancestral songs.) To top it off, everyone ate lunch with food grown by the students themselves.

Among the 14 or so intent listeners at this zoom session was a surprise guest from Pennsylvania, Barbara Blakistone, NE Field Representative for FFI. Alerted by Harrisburg Ambassador, Lise Skofronick, Barbara gave the program a “great” thumbs up.

POLICY UPDATES

Editor's Note: *The Board discusses and revises Club policies as needed. In order to keep the membership apprised of these revisions, the Newsletter will print policy updates from time to time.*

Here are two such policy updates to be added to the Board Manual and the Journey Coordinator Manual. They were approved on March 14, 2024

Annual Club Picnic Policy

The Board clarified and passed a policy regarding the Annual Club Picnic responsibilities. There had been some confusion, and this clarification should help things run more smoothly.

1. If there is an Incoming Journey in the summer, the relevant Journey Committee will schedule, plan, and organize all aspects of an FF Club Picnic. That includes inviting all Club members to a picnic where the Ambassadors will be present.
2. If there is no summer Incoming Journey picnic planned, the Activities Committee will schedule, plan, and organize all aspects of an FF Club Picnic (targeting July/August) and will budget appropriately for this possibility.

Please respond and be willing to help whenever the Committee reaches out requesting help with various related tasks - especially if a potluck option is chosen for the food.

POLICY UPDATES**Journey / Members Subsidy**

The Board approved a new monetary policy to provide a small gift to those who are actively participating and doing the work of making the Journeys run well. Here are the details of that policy:

1. A sum of \$300 will be given to every Incoming Journey Committee. This amount is to be reviewed every two years and is contingent upon the financial status of the Club. This money is to be used to reward FF members who are actively contributing to the functioning of the Club. Suggestion of ways to use this would be to partially or fully subsidize a Home Host's meal such as at the welcome or farewell events; reimburse drivers for gas; pay for tickets of a Host one day; reimburse people who contribute food to an event; etc. This is NOT to be used simply to pay the cost of renting a room or a picnic shelter which then benefits Ambassadors and Club members equally.
2. Journey Coordinators should be charging the Incoming Ambassadors \$25 each beyond the established budget, and that amount would be shared between the JC's. Therefore, they are not to receive a part of the \$300 (mentioned in Section 1 above).

At the moment our bank account is very healthy and we can afford to help make this aspect of contributing to our work just a bit less of a financial issue. It does cost money to Host as you are expected to attend events and activities with your Ambassador. On the other hand, you receive that kind of benefit from your Hosts when you travel. This is the essence of Friendship Force.
