We are both honored and humbled to assume the role of Co-Presidents for FF Wisconsin-Madison. Because we are relatively new to Friendship Force, the support and assistance of the Board and of veteran members has been very helpful in preparing us for our new role. We greatly appreciate their insights and mentorship. We welcome the newly elected officers and look forward to working with the standing committees and to engaging with all club members.

One of our major goals is to move the Club's strategic plan forward. During the May 21 strategic planning meeting, the Board and other members identified four priorities for the Club to focus on over the coming years. An ad hoc committee was created for each priority: the Diversify Membership Committee, the Marketing Committee, the Mission-Focused Travel and Education Committee, and the Partnership Committee. Each ad hoc committee will create an action plan with 2-3 achievable goals during the coming months to guide future directions for the club.

Sixteen club members plan to attend the FFI North American Regional Conference in Milwaukee in October. Sessions at the conference may provide innovative ideas for planning and goal setting. In addition, attendees will have opportunities to connect with delegates

from other Friendship Force clubs and learn about their work in the areas of marketing, connecting with other organizations, developing cultural experiences, and attracting a more diverse membership.


