A NOTE FROM THE Co-PRESIDENTS

The mission of Friendship Force is to promote global understanding across the barriers that separate people. Journeys are the primary way this mission is realized. The nine Ambassadors on the FFWM Outbound Journey to Ghana were repeatedly reminded of the mission. We were hosted by members of the Volta Lake Club and the Trinity Club of Legon. Both clubs warmly welcomed us with ceremonies that included dancing, singing, and even a bouquet of flowers.

During our two-week Journey, we visited a durbar, a village festival honoring the local chief; a carpentry workshop that makes "fantasy coffins" for elaborate Ghanaian funerals: and a Cedi Bead workshop where we observed how traditional glass beads are made from recycled glass bottles and learned about their significance in indigenous cultures. We also toured the Volta Lake Hydroelectric Plant and Dam; the Shai Hills Nature Preserve; the Kwame Nkrumah Mausoleum in Accra: the Volta Lake Hospital: and Lila's Child Care Foundation where we met Lila, the founder, and presented her and the children with books and bags of rice. visiting a Kente cloth weaving workshop and watching how Kente cloth is made, we attended a Kente Festival. We were entertained there by village chiefs and Queen Mothers in the Ghana/ Togo region and saw the best weavers in the area honored. We learned of Kente cloth's cultural heritage that contributes to cross-border cooperation between Ghana and Togo.

At the club's Annual Picnic at Marshall Park on Sept. 7, we shared Wisconsin food (brats, baked beans, potato and sauerkraut salads) and camaraderie. Several of the Ambassadors to Ghana shared favorite stories about host families that reinforced how FF helps with global understanding across countries. They talked about Ghanaian family values, funeral practices, religious services, and education. One of the Ambassadors described how her middle-class host family is striving for home ownership. Thank you to the picnic organizers – Gail, Jan, Donna M., Donna U. and Dorothy, with a special thanks to brat &hamburger griller, John Baldwin.

To reinforce our connection to the mission of Friendship Force and strengthen our bond with other clubs, fifteen club members are attending the FFI North American Regional Conference in Milwaukee in October. Conference workshops will provide innovative ideas for planning and goal setting. In addition, attendees will learn about the work of other clubs in the areas of marketing, connecting with other organizations, developing cultural experiences, attracting a more diverse membership, and promoting global understanding.

We are grateful to be leading a very active club and appreciate the involvement and support of our members.



#### Outbound: Brazil — May 27-June 6, 2025

We will travel first to Belo Horizonte, Brazil, from May 27 to May 31, 2025, then on to Belem, Brazil, from May 31 to June 6.

Belo Horizonte, population 2.3 million with over 6 million in the greater metro area, was the first planned city in Brazil. Located in the south-central part of the country, Belo Horizonte is surrounded by mountains and is known for its parks and 17 educational institutions in the area.

The city of Belém is in northeast Brazil about 60 miles from the Atlantic Ocean on the Para River, part of the Amazon River system. Nicknamed the "City of Mango Trees," it has an estimated population of 1.5 million people, with an additional 1 million living outside the city proper. From all reports there is a lot to see and do in Belém. Both cities have international airports.

**NOTE:** If you are interested in participating in the Brazil journey, you will need to apply with a **\$25 non-refundable application fee** to Journey Co-Managers Tom Miller or Kathy Speck by **November 3, 2024**. The application form is available in a few ways and forms:

The first way is to click on this <u>link</u> to print a paper copy to be filled by hand.

The second way is to click on this <u>link</u> for a PDF fillable application to be completed on your device (desktop, laptop, tablet, or phone) then printed and submitted.

The third method to apply is to logon to the my.friendshipforce.org website. Access the form through the website Help Center, then enter Ambassador Application in the search bar.

Once completed, either email the application to the Journey Managers or print and mail along with the application fee to Tom Miller, 5414 Denton Pl, Madison, WI 53711.

#### <u>Second Harvest — Recent service days</u>

On Wednesday, **July 31**, from 12:30 to 3:30 p.m. Vivian Norton, Donna Hussin, and Gail Holmes worked with seven middle school students from Blackhawk Church's Madison Mission program and a father/daughter team.

We had an easy and clean job of labeling 4 oz. plastic cups of cut green beans. 64 cups were stacked in tall boxes and our group completed 110 boxes for a total of over 7,000 labeled cups! We were energized by the enthusiasm and caring that these young people brought to the task.

The **August 28** group at Second Harvest Food Bank consisted of Helen Ann Rugowski, Maureen Kind, and Gail Holmes. A new member who was interested was unable to come at the last minute.

We worked with over a dozen high schoolers from the Madison Community Day School. Our first task was to package a dozen uncracked eggs into a carton and put 15 cartons into each large box.

When we finished that, we helped the students package ten half ears of frozen corn into a plastic bag and double seal it, and filled the large boxes with ten bags. We've done this before. We wonder if these monstrous crates of corn will ever run out!



#### **IN MEMORIAM**

#### Kay Babcock

Our Honorary Member, Kay Babcock, passed away on Sunday August 11, 2024.

Kay was unique in that she was on the very first Friendship Force of Wisconsin journey in 1978. There were 1200 applications for that trip. Because the plan was to charter a plane, only 250 positions were available.

As Kay told it, they did not know where they were going when they applied — that was the norm for the early exchanges! — but they were asked to list countries that they would *not* want to visit. Kay listed Uganda because they were taking their young children along and despot Idi Amin was the leader of Uganda at the time.

They later learned that they were going to Zurich, Switzerland. The chartered plane would deliver our group to Zurich and then make the return trip to Madison with 250 people from Switzerland aboard.

Another member shared a memory from traveling with the Babcocks from Vladavostock to Irkutsk in Russia: Any time the train stopped they were able to get out and walk around. You always knew where Kay was because she and Steve were handing out wiener whistles to children!

Kay was very active in our club. She and Steve hosted and traveled and supported the club in various ways over the many years of their membership. Kay was a pleasure to travel with and will be remembered for always having a smile on her face.

"Kay [and Steve] were founding members of The Friendship Force of Wisconsin, through which they developed life-long friendships around the world through hosting travelers and traveling themselves to many places. Their appreciation for diverse cultures was enhanced at home with participation in Foreign Foods (now called University League International Foods) a group that would get together to cook and enjoy foods, with a curated menu, from a pre-selected country several times a year."
